### Full-Time Faculty Position (at all ranks)

The Faculty of Social Sciences comprises nine departments, schools and institutes, which offer undergraduate, masters and doctoral programs in both English and French. With over 10,000 students, 260 full-time professors, and a wide array of programs and research centres, the Faculty of Social Sciences plays a key role at the heart of the University of Ottawa. Its graduate students are guided and trained by excellent researchers and undertake cutting-edge research in the Faculty's master's and Ph.D. programs.

The Faculty of Social Sciences welcomes applications for one tenure-track position (at all ranks) in its Graduate School of Public and International Affairs. Established in 2007, the School counts approximately 30 dedicated faculty members and 15 senior fellows and it offers a multidisciplinary Master's degree for students interested in pursuing careers related to public and international affairs in national or international institutions. The program focuses on training students to work in government or in private or non-governmental organizations as well as to prepare them for doctoral studies.

The successful candidate must have a strong research focus on policy issues, must welcome working in a multidisciplinary environment, and must have expertise and an active research program in at least one of the following areas:

- Economic growth
- International economics
- Macro aspects of public economics

Among his/her teaching responsibilities, the selected candidate will teach a course on macroeconomic policy in the multidisciplinary master's program in public and international affairs. Part of his/her teaching may also be in other academic units of the Faculty of Social Sciences

- Conduct research and publish
- Teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels
- Supervise MA and Ph.D. students
- Participate in academic and administrative activities of the University
- Perform other activities as specified in the collective agreement

### Qualifications

- Hold a Ph.D. in economics or in a related discipline (candidates who are close to completing a Ph.D. could be considered)
- Demonstrate excellence or the potential for excellence in teaching and research
- Possess a strong publication and research track record
- Experience working in government or in a non-governmental organization is an asset

Applicants must submit their curriculum vitae and a letter indicating their teaching and research experience and interests as well as their motivation to work in a multidisciplinary environment. They must also indicate their French and English language abilities and submit copies of their main publications. Applicants must also request that three referees send confidential letters of recommendation under separate cover.
